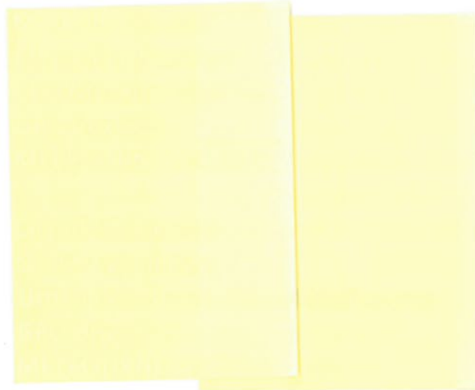

THE PERMIT ALLOWS: *Works to facilitate the 2018 Melbourne International Flower and Garden Show from 12th to 29th March 2018, in accordance with the following documents, as endorsed by the Executive Director and forming part of this permit:*

- 2018 MIFGS Garden Protection Method Statement;
- 2018 MIFGS Landscape Designer's Guide;
- 2018 MIFGS Power & Lighting Plan;
- 2018 MIFGS Irrigation Map
- 2018 MIFGS Irrigation Plan
- 2018 MIFGS Turf Reinstatement Process
- 2018 MIFGS CAD Map
- 2018 MIFGS Show Map

THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS APPLY TO THIS PERMIT:

1. This permit is only valid for the 2018 Melbourne International Flower and Garden Show;
2. Works (excluding turf reinstatement works) must not commence prior to Tuesday 27 February 2018 and must be completed by Thursday 29th March;
3. Works associated with turf reinstatement must be completed by 19 April 2018;
4. Physical alterations to the fabric of the Royal Exhibition Building is not permitted;
5. Digging, excavating, trenching or hole boring is not permitted to grassed surfaces;
6. Nailing, pruning, cutting or tying back of branches is not permitted to trees;
7. Penetration of the ground, including digging, pole placement, star picket use, peg placement use, is not permitted within the identified tree protection zone (diameter at breast height (measured at 1.4m above ground) x 12);
8. Lighting must not be fixed directly to any trees;


9. Protective ground cover that does not cause damage to the existing grassed areas must be used for all outdoor structures, equipment, deliveries and grassed areas in front of displays and between displays and pathways;
10. Vehicles are not permitted on grassed surfaces.
11. Heavy watering is not permitted during the four days prior to the installation of protective ground coverings, to ensure that the soil is moist, but not soft, at the time of the installation;
12. Use of road-base, crushed rock and granite sand to level exhibition areas is not permitted;
13. The following condition reports for the gardens are to be prepared by fully qualified professionals (independent from the event), and approved by the Executive Director, Heritage Victoria before 29th May 2018:
 - 13.1 Pre-event condition report based on a site inspection undertaken prior to 27 February 2018;
 - 13.2 Post-event condition report, including impacts, repair actions (including but not limited to aerating, scarification, top dressing, over seeding and fertilising of grassed areas), any variations to the approved documents, and recommendations for any outstanding repair actions;
 - 13.3 A soil compaction assessment, based on the condition of the place before and after, the event, including recommendations for future soil protection.
14. Recommendations included in the reports approved by the Executive Director, Heritage Victoria, under 13.2 and 13.3 above must be undertaken before 29 July 2018;
15. The Executive Director is to be given five working days notice of the intention to commence the approved works.
16. Approved works or activities are to be planned and carried out in a manner which prevents damage to the registered place / object. However, if other previously hidden original or inaccessible details of the object or place are uncovered, any works that may affect such items shall immediately cease. The Executive Director shall be notified of the details immediately to enable Heritage Victoria representatives to inspect and record the items, and for discussion to take place on the possible retention of the items, or the issue of a modified approval.
17. All works must cease and this office be contacted if historical archaeological artefacts or deposits are discovered during any excavation or subsurface works. Should any munitions or other potentially explosive artefacts be discovered, Victoria Police is to be immediately alerted whilst the site is cleared of all personnel.
18. The Executive Director is to be informed when the approved works have been completed.
19. The development approved by this permit is to be carried out in accordance with the endorsed drawings, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Executive Director, Heritage Victoria.

NOTE THAT PERMISSION HAS BEEN GIVEN FOR INSPECTIONS OF THE PLACE OR OBJECT TO BE UNDERTAKEN DURING THE CARRYING OUT OF WORKS, AND WITHIN SIX (6) MONTHS OF NOTIFICATION OF THEIR COMPLETION.

TAKE NOTICE THAT ANY NATURAL PERSON WHO CARRIES OUT WORKS OR ACTIVITIES NOT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PERMIT OR CONDITIONS IS GUILTY OF AN OFFENCE AND LIABLE TO A PENALTY OF UP TO 120 PENALTY UNITS (\$19,028), OR IN THE CASE OF A BODY CORPORATE 600 PENALTY UNITS (\$95,142).

THE ATTENTION OF THE OWNER AND/OR APPLICANT IS DRAWN TO THE NEED TO OBTAIN ALL OTHER RELEVANT PERMITS PRIOR TO THE COMMENCEMENT OF WORKS.
