THE PERMIT ALLOWS: Internal refurbishment works to 1875 school building; demolition of existing toilet block and covered walkway; construction of new amenities block, new covered walkway and addition to contemporary BER building; hard and soft landscaping, and conservation works, generally in accordance with the following documents:

- Revised Heritage Impact Statement, prepared by Michael Taylor Architecture & Heritage, dated 17 February 2022
- Architectural drawings, drawing nos. A.00.01-A.10.20, prepared by FMSA, dated 15 November 2021.
- Landscape Working Drawings, drawing nos. LWD01-LWD12, prepared by FMSA, dated 10 January 2022.

THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS APPLY TO THIS PERMIT:

- 1. The permission granted for this permit shall expire if one of the following circumstances applies: the permitted works have not commenced within two (2) years of the original date of issue of this permit, or are not completed within four (4) years of the original date of issue of this permit unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Executive Director, Heritage Victoria.
- 2. The Executive Director, Heritage Victoria is to be given five working days' notice of the intention to commence the approved works.
- 3. Prior to the commencement of any of the works approved by this permit a **constructionready set of detailed drawings** must be submitted for the endorsement of the Executive Director, Heritage Victoria and when endorsed becomes part of the permit. Should further minor changes in accordance with the intent and approach of the endorsed documentation become necessary, correspondence and supporting documentation must be prepared and lodged in accordance with the permit condition for assessment by the Executive Director, Heritage Victoria who will advise on the approach to be taken to address these matters.
- 4. Prior to the commencement of any of the works approved by this permit, a **Construction Management Plan** (the Plan) must be provided for endorsement by the Executive Director, Heritage Victoria and once endorsed becomes part of the permit. The Plan must include:

a. A sequencing program for the approved works, including final dates for the set up and pack down, and the presentation of the event;

- b. Details of any temporary infrastructure and services required;
- c. Protection methods for the heritage place during the undertaking of the works;
- d. A work site layout plan;

e. A tree/vegetation management and protection plan prepared in accordance with AS4970 Protection of trees on development sites.

- 5. Prior to the commencement of any of the works approved by this permit, the name of an experienced Heritage Consultant/Heritage Architect must be provided in writing to the Executive Director, Heritage Victoria. The nominated Heritage Consultant is to be engaged to provide advice to assist with the preparation of the schedule required by Condition 6, and in all instances where significant building fabric is impacted by adjacent works, refurbishment, conservation or repair works.
- Prior to the commencement of any of the works approved by this permit, a Final Schedule of Conservation Works (the Schedule) must be provided for endorsement by the Executive Director, Heritage Victoria and once endorsed becomes part of the permit. The Schedule must include details for:

a. Methodology for slate roof replacement, including whether battens will need to be replaced;

- b. A schedule of door repairs;
- c. A schedule of finishes and colours.

The approved conservation works must be completed within the period of validity of this permit.

- 7. Approved works or activities are to be planned and carried out in a manner which prevents damage to the registered place/object. However, if other previously hidden original or inaccessible details of the object or place are uncovered, any works that may affect such items must immediately cease. The Executive Director, Heritage Victoria must be notified of the details immediately to enable Heritage Victoria representatives to inspect and record the items, and for discussion to take place on the possible retention of the items, or the issue of a modified approval.
- 8. All works must cease, and Heritage Victoria must be contacted if historical archaeological artefacts or deposits are discovered during any excavation or subsurface works. Should any munitions or other potentially explosive artefacts be discovered, Victoria Police is to be immediately alerted and the site is to be immediately cleared of all personnel.
- 9. The Executive Director, Heritage Victoria must be informed when the approved works have been completed.

## NOTE THAT PERMISSION HAS BEEN GIVEN FOR INSPECTIONS OF THE PLACE OR OBJECT TO BE UNDERTAKEN DURING THE CARRYING OUT OF WORKS, AND WITHIN SIX (6) MONTHS OF NOTIFICATION OF THEIR COMPLETION.

TAKE NOTICE THAT ANY NATURAL PERSON WHO CARRIES OUT WORKS OR ACTIVITIES NOT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PERMIT OR CONDITIONS IS GUILTY OF AN OFFENCE AND LIABLE TO A PENALTY OF 120 PENALTY UNITS (\$21,808.80 FROM 1 JULY 2021) OR IN THE CASE OF A BODY CORPORATE 600 PENALTY UNITS (\$109,044 FROM 1 JULY 2021) UNDER s104 THE HERITAGE ACT 2017.

WORKS UNDERTAKEN WITHOUT A PERMIT OR PERMIT EXEMPTION CAN INCUR A FINE OF UP TO 4800 PENALTY UNITS (\$872,352 FROM 1 JULY 2021) FOR A NATURAL PERSON OR 5 YEARS IMPRISONMENT OR BOTH AND UP TO 9600 PENALTY UNITS (\$1,744,704 FROM 1 JULY 2021) IN THE CASE OF A BODY CORPORATE UNDER SECTION 87 OF THE HERITAGE ACT 2017.

THE ATTENTION OF THE OWNER AND/OR APPLICANT IS DRAWN TO THE NEED TO OBTAIN ALL OTHER RELEVANT PERMITS PRIOR TO THE COMMENCEMENT OF WORKS.
