THE PERMIT ALLOWS: For installation of rooftop solar panels to the former St Vincent De Paul Boys Orphanage at 231 Cecil Street, South Melbourne, generally in accordance with the following documents:

- Heritage Impact Statement, Fastnet Consulting (16 June 2022)
- PV Installation Works Summary, Sassafras Group Ono date)
- Drawing Set, Sassafras Group (26 June 2021/21 March 2022)
- Structural Engineers Report, McDuling Consulting (31 May 2022)

THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS APPLY TO THIS PERMIT:

- 1. The permission granted for this permit shall expire if one of the following circumstances applies: the permitted works have not commenced within two (2) years of the original date of issue of this permit, or are not completed within four (4) years of the original date of issue of this permit.
- 2. The Executive Director Heritage Victoria is to be given five working days' notice of the intention to commence the approved works.
- 3. No solar panels are to be installed to slate roofs.
- 4. Prior to the commencement of any of the works approved by this permit, a **Heritage Protection Plan** must be provided for endorsement by the Executive Director Heritage Victoria and once endorsed becomes part of the permit. The Heritage Protection Plan must include a sequencing program for the approved works, details of any temporary infrastructure and services required, protection methods for the heritage place during the undertaking of the works, and a work site layout plan.
- 5. Prior to the commencement of any of the works approved by this permit, a construction ready (marked as such) set of construction drawings must be submitted to the Executive Director Heritage Victoria for approval. Once approved, the drawings will be endorsed and will then form part of the permit. The drawings must include a suitable UV stable resilient EPDM barrier between the aluminium supports and the roof material to create galvanic isolation between the dissimilar materials and must demonstrate how they comply with the guidelines for the prevention of galvanic corrosion in BlueScope Steel's 'Guide to good practice steel roofing and photovoltaic panels' Technical Bulletin 36 (May 2019, Revision 3).

- 6. Should further **minor changes** in accordance with the intent and approach of the endorsed documentation become necessary, correspondence and supporting documentation must be prepared and lodged for assessment by the Executive Director Heritage Victoria who will advise on the approach to be taken to address these matters.
- 7. Approved works or activities are to be planned and carried out in a manner which prevents damage to the registered place/object. However, if other previously hidden original or inaccessible details of the object or place are uncovered, any works that may affect such items must immediately cease. The Executive Director Heritage Victoria must be notified of the details immediately to enable Heritage Victoria representatives to inspect and record the items, and for discussion to take place on the possible retention of the items, or the issue of a modified approval.
- 8. All works must cease, and Heritage Victoria must be contacted if historical archaeological artefacts or deposits are discovered during any excavation or subsurface works.
- 9. The Executive Director Heritage Victoria must be informed when the approved works have been completed.
- 10. The works approved by this permit must be carried out in their entirety unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Executive Director Heritage Victoria.

NOTE THAT PERMISSION HAS BEEN GIVEN FOR INSPECTIONS OF THE PLACE OR OBJECT TO BE UNDERTAKEN DURING THE CARRYING OUT OF WORKS, AND WITHIN SIX (6) MONTHS OF NOTIFICATION OF THEIR COMPLETION.

TAKE NOTICE THAT ANY NATURAL PERSON WHO CARRIES OUT WORKS OR ACTIVITIES NOT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PERMIT OR CONDITIONS IS GUILTY OF AN OFFENCE AND LIABLE TO A PENALTY OF 120 PENALTY UNITS (\$21,808.80 FROM 1 JULY 2021) OR IN THE CASE OF A BODY CORPORATE 600 PENALTY UNITS (\$109,044 FROM 1 JULY 2021) UNDER \$104 THE HERITAGE ACT 2017.

WORKS UNDERTAKEN WITHOUT A PERMIT OR PERMIT EXEMPTION CAN INCUR A FINE OF UP TO 4800 PENALTY UNITS (\$872,352 FROM 1 JULY 2021) FOR A NATURAL PERSON OR 5 YEARS IMPRISONMENT OR BOTH AND UP TO 9600 PENALTY UNITS (\$1,744,704 FROM 1 JULY 2021) IN THE CASE OF A BODY CORPORATE UNDER SECTION 87 OF THE HERITAGE ACT 2017.
