THE PERMIT ALLOWS: Conservation works to the South Eastern Window and bell hanging system and bell including upgrade to electrified hammer. Works include off-site conservation of both items, generally in accordance with the following documents:

- Heritage Impact Statement for Christ Church Complex prepared by Conservation Studio dated 28 October 2024
- Drawings prepared by BG&E dated 19 March 2024

THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS APPLY TO THIS PERMIT:

GENERAL CONDITIONS

- The permission granted for this permit will expire if one of the following circumstances applies: the permitted works have not commenced within two (2) years of the original date of issue of this permit, or are not completed within four (4) years of the original date of issue of this permit. Commencement of the permit begins with onsite physical works.
- 2. The Executive Director Heritage Victoria is to be given five working days' notice of the intention to commence the approved works.
- 3. Should further minor changes in accordance with the intent and approach of the endorsed documentation become necessary, correspondence and supporting documentation must be prepared and lodged in accordance with the permit condition for endorsement by the Executive Director Heritage Victoria. If the Executive Director considers that the changes are not minor, an amendment to the permit or a new application will be required.
- 4. If any damage or unexpected events occur during the de-installation, transport, or installation of any heritage fabric Heritage Victoria must be immediately notified.
- 5. Approved works or activities are to be planned and carried out in a manner which prevents damage to the registered place/object. However, if other previously hidden original or inaccessible details of the object or place are uncovered, any works that may affect such items must immediately cease. The Executive Director Heritage Victoria must be notified of the details immediately to enable Heritage Victoria representatives to inspect and record the items, and for discussion to take place on the possible retention of the items, or the issue of a modified approval.
- 6. All works must cease, and Heritage Victoria must be contacted if historical archaeological artefacts or deposits are discovered during any excavation or subsurface works.

- 7. The Executive Director Heritage Victoria must be informed when the approved works have been completed.
- 8. The works approved by this permit must be carried out in their entirety unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Executive Director Heritage Victoria.

STAINED GLASS WINDOWS

- 9. Prior to the commencement of any of the works to the stain glassed windows approved by this permit, a **suitably experienced conservator**, approved in writing by the Executive Director Heritage Victoria, must be engaged to complete the conservation works to the stained-glass windows.
- 10. Prior to the commencement of any of the works to the stain glassed windows approved by this permit, a **Heritage Protection Plan** for the stained-glass window must be submitted to the Executive Director Heritage Victoria for approval. Once approved, the Heritage Protection Plan will be endorsed and will then form part of the permit. The Heritage Protection Plan must include a sequencing program for the approved works, details of any temporary infrastructure and services required, protection methods for the heritage place during the undertaking of the works, a work site layout plan, methodology for removal, protection methods while in transit, and detail of the offsite storage. This must include detail of the temporary hoarding being installed following the removal of the window. The Heritage Protection Plan must also include a dilapidation report (including images) for the stained-glass windows to record condition prior to the commencement of works approved by this permit
- 11. Prior to the commencement of the conservation works to the stain glassed windows, a **conservation methodology** (prepared by the endorsed conservator) must be submitted to the Executive Director Heritage Victoria for approval. Once approved, the methodology will be endorsed and will then form part of the permit.
- 12. The stained glass window is required to be re-installed within twelve (12) months of date of removal unless otherwise approved in writing by the Executive Director Heritage Victoria.

BELL TOWER WORKS

- 13. Prior to the commencement of any of the works to the bell tower approved by this permit, a **suitably experienced conservator**, approved in writing by the Executive Director Heritage Victoria, must be engaged to complete the conservation works to the bell.
- 14. Prior to the commencement of any of the works to the bell tower approved by this permit, a **construction ready (marked as such) set of architectural drawings**, must be submitted to the Executive Director Heritage Victoria for approval. Once approved, the drawings will be endorsed and will then form part of the permit.
- 15. Prior to the commencement of any of the works approved by this permit, a **Heritage Protection Plan** for the bell must be submitted to the Executive Director Heritage Victoria for approval. Once approved, the Heritage Protection Plan will be endorsed and will then form part of the permit. The Heritage Protection Plan must include a sequencing program for the approved works, details of any temporary infrastructure and services required, protection methods for the heritage place during the undertaking of the works, a work site layout plan, methodology for removal, protection methods while in transit, and detail of the offsite storage. The Heritage Protection Plan must also include a dilapidation report (including

images) for the bell to record condition prior to the commencement of works approved by this permit

- 16. Prior to the commencement of the conservation works to the bell tower, a **conservation methodology** (prepared by the endorsed conservator) must be submitted to the Executive Director Heritage Victoria for approval. Once approved, the methodology will be endorsed and will then form part of the permit.
- 17. The bell is required to be re-installed within twelve (12) months of date of removal unless otherwise approved in writing by the Executive Director Heritage Victoria.

NOTE THAT PERMISSION HAS BEEN GIVEN FOR INSPECTIONS OF THE PLACE OR OBJECT TO BE UNDERTAKEN DURING THE CARRYING OUT OF WORKS, AND WITHIN SIX (6) MONTHS OF NOTIFICATION OF THEIR COMPLETION.

TAKE NOTICE THAT ANY NATURAL PERSON WHO CARRIES OUT WORKS OR ACTIVITIES NOT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PERMIT OR CONDITIONS IS GUILTY OF AN OFFENCE AND LIABLE TO A PENALTY OF 120 PENALTY UNITS (\$23,710.80 FROM 1 JULY 2024) OR IN THE CASE OF A BODY CORPORATE 600 PENALTY UNITS (\$118,554 FROM 1 JULY 2024) UNDER s104 THE HERITAGE ACT 2017.

WORKS UNDERTAKEN WITHOUT A PERMIT OR PERMIT EXEMPTION CAN INCUR A FINE OF UP TO 4800 PENALTY UNITS (\$948,432 FROM 1 JULY 2024) FOR A NATURAL PERSON OR 5 YEARS IMPRISONMENT OR BOTH AND UP TO 9600 PENALTY UNITS (\$1,896,864 FROM 1 JULY 2024) IN THE CASE OF A BODY CORPORATE UNDER SECTION 87 OF THE HERITAGE ACT 2017.
