THE PERMIT ALLOWS: Demolition and construction works connected to the proposed installation of an internal stair between two floors (level 6 and level 7) of ICI House, at 1-4 Nicholson Street, East Melbourne, generally in accordance with the following documents:

- Architectural Tender Drawing A03.001 Revision TT2, Bates Smart (29 March 2021)
- Design Drawings, Active Metal (18 March 2021)

THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS APPLY TO THIS PERMIT:

- 1. The permission granted for this permit shall expire if one of the following circumstances applies: the permitted works have not commenced within two (2) years of the original date of issue of this permit, or are not completed within four (4) years of the original date of issue of this permit unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Executive Director, Heritage Victoria.
- 2. The Executive Director, Heritage Victoria is to be given five (5) days' notice of the intention to commence the approved works.
- 3. Prior to the commencement of any of the works approved by this permit, a constructionready set of architectural drawings must be submitted for the endorsement of the Executive Director, Heritage Victoria and when endorsed becomes part of this permit.
- 4. **Prior** to commencement of any of the works approved by this permit an archival quality photographic survey is to be prepared to record the heritage place before site preparation and setup works commence. The survey is to be prepared in accordance with the Heritage Council/Heritage Victoria Technical Note entitled "Photographic Recording for Heritage Places and Objects" (available on the Heritage Council website or from Heritage Victoria on request). Initially, a single copy of the survey is to be provided in electronic (hard drive) format only. The Applicant will then be informed in writing that the condition is partially satisfied. At the completion of the approved works, and prior to the fulfilment of Condition 3, two copies of the completed photographic survey updated to incorporate any hidden fabric, finishes or latent conditions found on site during the undertaking of the approved works are to be produced with one copy submitted to the Executive Director Heritage Victoria for approval in writing prior to commencement of any of the works approved by this permit. On approval of the first copy the second copy is to be lodged with the La Trobe Picture Collection, 328 Swanston Street Melbourne 3000, State Library of Victoria or delivered by courier to Despatch: 174 Little Lonsdale Street Melbourne 3000. Deliveries accepted from 7.30 to 4.30 (A receipt will be sent the day the material is received.) Heritage Victoria will then confirm in

writing that the condition is **fully satisfied** and return the electronic (hard drive) format survey lodged prior to the commencement of the approved works.

- 5. Should further minor changes in accordance with the intent and approach of the endorsed documentation become necessary, correspondence and supporting documentation must be prepared and lodged in accordance with the permit condition for assessment by the Executive Director, Heritage Victoria who will advise on the approach to be taken to address these matters.
- 6. Approved works or activities are to be planned and carried out in a manner which prevents damage to the registered place/object. However, if other previously hidden original or inaccessible details of the object or place are uncovered, any works that may affect such items must immediately cease. The Executive Director, Heritage Victoria must be notified of the details immediately to enable Heritage Victoria representatives to inspect and record the items, and for discussion to take place on the possible retention of the items, or the issue of a modified approval.
- 7. All works must cease, and Heritage Victoria must be contacted if historical archaeological artefacts or deposits are discovered during any excavation or subsurface works. Should any munitions or other potentially explosive artefacts be discovered, Victoria Police is to be immediately alerted and the site is to be immediately cleared of all personnel.
- 8. The Executive Director, Heritage Victoria must be informed when the approved works have been completed.

NOTE THAT PERMISSION HAS BEEN GIVEN FOR INSPECTIONS OF THE PLACE OR OBJECT TO BE UNDERTAKEN DURING THE CARRYING OUT OF WORKS, AND WITHIN SIX (6) MONTHS OF NOTIFICATION OF THEIR COMPLETION.

TAKE NOTICE THAT ANY NATURAL PERSON WHO CARRIES OUT WORKS OR ACTIVITIES NOT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PERMIT OR CONDITIONS IS GUILTY OF AN OFFENCE AND LIABLE TO A PENALTY OF 120 PENALTY UNITS (\$21,808.80 FROM 1 JULY 2021) OR IN THE CASE OF A BODY CORPORATE 600 PENALTY UNITS (\$109,044 FROM 1 JULY 2021) UNDER s104 THE HERITAGE ACT 2017.

WORKS UNDERTAKEN WITHOUT A PERMIT OR PERMIT EXEMPTION CAN INCUR A FINE OF UP TO 4800 PENALTY UNITS (\$872,352 FROM 1 JULY 2021) FOR A NATURAL PERSON OR 5 YEARS IMPRISONMENT OR BOTH AND UP TO 9600 PENALTY UNITS (\$1,744,704 FROM 1 JULY 2021) IN THE CASE OF A BODY CORPORATE UNDER SECTION 87 OF THE HERITAGE ACT 2017.
