THE PERMIT ALLOWS: Remedial works to the building including reinstatement of interior linings, fixtures and fittings; repair and restoration works to doors, windows, skirting and architraves; reinstatement of porch roof; reconstruction of some masonry walls; and removal of temporary propping and associated repairs to external walls, in accordance with the following documents, as endorsed and forming part of this permit:

• Architectural drawings prepared by Andronas Conservation Architecture, titled Remedial Works – Stage 3, Interior Works, numbered A.00 - A.15 (Rev HV1), dated 28 September 2021.

THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS APPLY TO THIS PERMIT:

- 1. The permission granted for this permit shall expire if one of the following circumstances applies: the permitted works have not commenced within two (2) years of the original date of issue of this permit, or are not completed within four (4) years of the original date of issue of this permit unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Executive Director, Heritage Victoria.
- 2. The Executive Director, Heritage Victoria is to be given five working days' notice of the intention to commence the approved works.
- 3. Approved works or activities are to be planned and carried out in a manner which prevents damage to the registered place/object. However, if other previously hidden original or inaccessible details of the object or place are uncovered, any works that may affect such items must immediately cease. The Executive Director, Heritage Victoria must be notified of the details immediately to enable Heritage Victoria representatives to inspect and record the items, and for discussion to take place on the possible retention of the items, or the issue of a modified approval.
- 4. Should further changes in accordance with the intent and approach of the endorsed documentation become necessary, correspondence and supporting documentation must be submitted to the Executive Director who will advise on the approach to be taken to address these matters.
- 5. All works must cease, and Heritage Victoria must be contacted if historical archaeological artefacts or deposits are discovered during any excavation or subsurface works. Should any munitions or other potentially explosive artefacts be discovered, Victoria Police is to be immediately alerted and the site is to be immediately cleared of all personnel.
- 6. The Executive Director, Heritage Victoria must be informed when the approved works have been completed.

NOTE THAT PERMISSION HAS BEEN GIVEN FOR INSPECTIONS OF THE PLACE OR OBJECT TO BE UNDERTAKEN DURING THE CARRYING OUT OF WORKS, AND WITHIN SIX (6) MONTHS OF NOTIFICATION OF THEIR COMPLETION.

TAKE NOTICE THAT ANY NATURAL PERSON WHO CARRIES OUT WORKS OR ACTIVITIES NOT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PERMIT OR CONDITIONS IS GUILTY OF AN OFFENCE AND LIABLE TO A PENALTY OF 120 PENALTY UNITS (\$21,808.80 FROM 1 JULY 2021) OR IN THE CASE OF A BODY CORPORATE 600 PENALTY UNITS (\$109,044 FROM 1 JULY 2021) UNDER \$104 THE HERITAGE ACT 2017.

WORKS UNDERTAKEN WITHOUT A PERMIT OR PERMIT EXEMPTION CAN INCUR A FINE OF UP TO 4800 PENALTY UNITS (\$872,352 FROM 1 JULY 2021) FOR A NATURAL PERSON OR 5 YEARS IMPRISONMENT OR BOTH AND UP TO 9600 PENALTY UNITS (\$1,744,704 FROM 1 JULY 2021) IN THE CASE OF A BODY CORPORATE UNDER SECTION 87 OF THE HERITAGE ACT 2017.
